Unvaccinated people who already had COVID-19 are **two times more likely to get COVID-19 again** than fully vaccinated people ¹

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends waiting 90 days to get the COVID-19 vaccine after

- monoclonal antibodies or convalescent plasma COVID-19 treatment, or
- multisystem inflammatory syndrome (MIS-A or MIS-C) diagnosis
