# **Be a Host Family:**

Help medical students understand the experiences of families of children with disabilities

Participate in the Seminar on Family Centered Care & Developmental Disabilities, Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School!

- The seminar is held 6-8 times a year.
- Families can host as often as they want, usually 2-4 times per year.
- Most visits last 2-3 hours. Start and end timing are flexible. All members of the family are welcome to participate.

Host families will recieve a \$100 dollar stipend for each group of students they host through support from the New Jersey Council on Developmental Disabilities.
